A Week Leading up to the Party

Help Your Child Get Excited for the Show

Get your child excited about having a real magician perform right in their own home! Visit kirbythemagician.com and watch a few videos together.

Kids love recognizing familiar faces—it turns "meeting a stranger" into "Hey, I know that guy!" This can be especially helpful if your child is shy. Watching a clip or two ahead of time helps build excitement and makes the magic feel more personal.




Get Your Child Ready to Participate

Let your child know they may have a chance to be part of the magic show! This experience is all about making your child feel special and celebrated. If your child is feeling shy, don't worry—Kirby has fun, low-pressure ways to include them without putting them on the spot.

Before the Show

Clear a Space for an **Indoor Party**

Try to set aside a 6x6 foot area where Kirby can perform comfortably. Ideally, position him against a plain wall—this keeps the focus on the magic. Avoid placing the performance area in front of a snack table, high-traffic walkway, or anything that might invite interruptions. If a window is behind the setup, be sure to close the curtains to minimize outside distractions.





Find a Spot for an Outdoor Party

Planning a park party? Arrive early to grab the best spot! Look for a nice shady area—under a tree is perfect on a sunny day. If the kids are sitting in full sun, they'll be too hot and wiggly to enjoy the show.

Morning party? Bring a few blankets—the grass might be damp.

Avoid setting up near loud playgrounds or busy paths —anything that can steal the spotlight from the magic. And if it's a breezy day, be ready to anchor light party decorations—wind has a habit of making things disappear (and not in the magical way)!

Limit Distractions

The goal is to limit distractions and keep the kids focused on the show. Hide all shiny things! If the kids have their hands free, they can focus on clapping, pointing, and be more open to interaction.



Put Toys & Balloons Away

Kids are less likely to get distracted when toys and balloons are put away.

Wait to Serve Food

Food and magic don't mix! If cupcakes, pizza, or juice boxes come out during the show, the kids suddenly have *two* things to focus on.

For the best experience, plan the magic show before serving any food. With full attention on the fun, the kids will enjoy the show so much more—and cleanup will be easier too!



Save the Party Favors for Later

As soon as kids get their hands on noisemakers, guess what happens? They use them—immediately and enthusiastically! That's great for a celebration, but not so great during a magic show. To keep the focus on fun, wait until after the performance to hand out favors.

A great time? Right after the birthday song or as part of a take-home goodie bag. That way, the kids go home happy—and the magic stays magical.



Tiny party guests can get curious—and sometimes that curiosity leads them straight into the performance area! If a toddler wanders too close to the magic zone, feel free to gently guide them back to the audience. Kirby might be mid-trick and not notice them right away.

There's no harm in briefly pausing the show to keep things safe—it helps everyone stay focused and sets a great example for the rest of the kids. With your help, the magic stays on track and everyone has a great time!




Final Thoughts

Photo Spot After the Show - Set up a "Magic Photo Spot" with Kirby and the birthday child after the show. You'll love having captured these moments

Suggested Party Timeline

Help things run smoothly with this simple flow: (It's just a suggestion)

0:00 - Guests arrive

0:15 – Free play or prepared games

0:45 - Magic show begins

0:45 - Cake & birthday song

2:00 – Presents or goodie bags


Distraction Free Zone - Pets in another room, loud toys turned off, bounce house turned off, and no balloons popping during the show helps keep everyone focused.

Birthday Child Spotlight - Kirby will invite the birthday child to help with a trick! Let your child know they might get a special moment during the show.

Seating Tips - Lay down a rug or blanket for kids to sit on near the front. Grownups can sit behind them. It helps everyone see.

Encourage On-Time Arrival – Mention "Magic Show starts at [time]" instead of just the party start time. It helps ensure guests are there when the show begins and don't miss the fun.

Quick Tip on Balloons - They're fun—but put them away during the show. They tend to roll, bounce, and pop at the worst possible time!
